## **Sudan & USAfrica: Urgent dangers to Black Africa**

### 1] Sudan

In Sudan, Black Africans (The Afro-Sudanese in South Sudan, Darfur, Nubia, etc) are fighting against an Arab settler minority rule, from Khartoum, that is worse, much worse, than Apartheid. The Sudan situation has many of the features of Apartheid and, to make things worse, the raiding of black African villages by Arabs who sell black captives into slavery in Northern Sudan and other parts of the Arab world, is still going on there today in the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

Our black African brothers in Sudan deserve as much support and help as Black Africa gave to the black Southern Africans in their long struggles against Apartheid and colonialism. It is for the purpose of mobilizing Pan-Africanist solidarity with the South Sudanese in their liberation struggle against Arab colonialism and enslavement that CAACBA is urging the formation of country SSFAs (e.g. the Nigeria-South Sudan Friendship Association).

The South Sudanese, after a 50years war of liberation (1956-2005) finally got Khartoum to sign the Comprehensive Peace Agreement, CPA, in 2005. The CPA has the backing of the International Community. It grants the South Sudanese limited autonomy through the Government of South Sudan, and provides for a Self-Determination referendum in 2011. The referendum will give the people of South Sudan the chance to decide whether South Sudan will remain within Sudan or secede and become independent.

The key aim of the SSFAs is to mobilize help for South Sudan in its political and diplomatic struggle to ensure peace through the full implementation of the CPA.

### 2] USAfrica

Though few recognize it as yet, the USAfrica project is a mortal danger to the autonomy, security and survival of Black Africans

This Afro-Arab USAfrica is simply a tool in Gadafi's campaign to complete, in one fell swoop, the centuries-old Arab ambition to conquer and enslave all of black Africa. Gadafi wants to go down in Arab history as the final conqueror of all of Black Africa. For the past 40 years he has pursued that grand ambition. After failing to seize different chunks of Black Africa piecemeal, he has now found a way to grab it all in one move.

*What is the danger we must recognize?*

***CAACBA submits that 50 years after whenever this USAfrica is proclaimed, all the land of the African continent, from Cape Town to Alexandria, and from Dakar to Mogadishu, will become Arab land. It will all be taken over by Arab settlers. Any blacks still found there will be like those now in Mauritania and Darfur: a displaced or enslaved population on the way to extermination.***
